### **Curatorial News**

This summer we were chosen to participate in the Williams College Summer Arts Internship program in partnership with Chesterwood. One of our projects was to support curatorial researcher Dana Pilson who is currently engaged in cataloguing works in the Chesterwood collection that relate to French's public monument commissions. Working with the extensive Chesterwood archival collection, which is held by the Chapin Library at Williams College, and with Chesterwood's on-site Study Collections Gallery, we developed independent interpretations of two monumental series by French: Four Continents (1907), and the Manhattan Bridge group, Manhattan and Brooklyn (1916). Both sculptural groups exemplify French's prowess at sculpting neoclassical, allegorical figures with attention to symbolism and detail. Each sculpture also reveals antiquation in French's views and representations of the world, thus offering opportunities for critical analysis of his work on both artistic and historical levels. Our work with these public monuments coincides with current debates surrounding the legitimacy of displaying sculptures that preserve and

celebrate, whether implicitly or explicitly, ideologies of imperialism or racism now held reproachable. Our essays on the sculptural groups will be incorporated into the Collections Cataloguing project and will eventually be made available through an on-line exhibition that will explore the hundreds of plaster models in Chesterwood's collection that relate to his public monument commissions across the country.

#### **Buildings and Grounds Projects**



Completed: new cedar roof and decorative trellis on the residence

This spring and summer marked immense progress in the third phase of the rehabilitation of the historic 1901 residence. With the first two phases complete (exterior stucco work and upgrades to exterior utilities), this phase completed the rebuilding and stuccoing of the chimneys, new cedar shake roof tiles, the complete abatement and renovation of the basement - new concrete floor, new walls with water deterring drainage, new water tank, new elevator shaft to second floor - to name a few of the modern safety and access improvements. The basement is now prepared to become a much-needed climate-controlled collections storage area for paintings and sculpture as well as a place to hold the Chesterwood institutional archives and accommodate researchers. While the residence had to be completely emptied and closed to the public during the renovation, we are on track to bring the historic rooms on the main floor back for viewing by next July.

Elemental Matters: The Sculpture of Jonathan Prince remains on view throughout the grounds at Chesterwood through October 24th. Visitors have come away impressed by how the natural beauty and cultivated landscape at Chesterwood intersects beautifully with Prince's work, crafted in CorTen and stainless steel, with multifaceted, shining surfaces that reflect the outdoors so effectively that art and world seem to meld into each other. Prince's work challenges the visual boundaries between solid and liquid forms, suggests ancient or futuristic relics, and evokes humanistic emotional and physiological states. Come visit and ponder compelling questions over the physicality of materials, and the symbolism within abstraction.
